The Words of Our Lord

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

- No Bible Classes, Sunday School or Coffee Hour will be available until move out of Phase 4 of the reopening plan.
- The Fellowship Center is closed for general use because it is now being used as a classroom. To keep it sanitized, we ask you do not enter it during the weekend.
